Dear Parents and Caregivers

This week we hosted 21 Japanese students and two teachers from our Sister School, Sugunami High School, which is located near the centre of Tokyo. 13 of our Hutt Valley High School students visited Sugunami last year and have been eagerly awaiting their guests' arrival in New Zealand. Despite several days of wet weather the Japanese students enjoyed every minute of their trip. They quickly established strong friendships with their host buddies and enjoyed spending time experiencing school in NZ. The Sugunami students were surprised to see students using digital technology in class, as their school in Japan has no WiFi! It was also a great opportunity to learn about Maori culture, making pois and learning a waiata with some of our Senior Maori students. Thanks to Nanaia Himona 11TS for her work leading the performance of the waiata at the farewell party. Another highlight for these students was spending time with their host families around Wellington. It was clear to see the strong bond that had formed over such a short period as they tearfully said goodbye on Wednesday morning. This exchange has been a great opportunity to embrace a new culture and establish global friendships and connections. I would like to thank all the host families who willingly opened their



homes and gave up their time to host a student. The photograph below shows the size of such an event, with the students from both schools and members of their host families present. We are now looking forward to our next trip to visit Sugunami in April, 2019.

This week we also need to congratulate our newest national champions in sport, as the girls' team won the National Secondary Schools Ultimate Championship held in Taupo, defeating Gisborne's Lytton High School 10-6. The boys' team also did well, finishing in second place after going down to Auckland Grammar 12-10. Congratulations to both teams. A point to note is not just the strength of our teams in this sport but their spirit. Hutt Valley High School also won the tournament's Spirit of the Game Award, and the kind of spirit that coaches Mike Sheridan (parent) and Audrey Siple (teacher) have generated was evidenced by the fact that three of last year's squads, Tane Rolfe, Emma Doile and Beth Thompson - all New Zealand representatives while at school and now all at their tertiary studies - accompanied the teams as coaches. Seven current New Zealand representatives were within our teams competing at the tournament.

Kamar Parent Portal Logon
