Dear Parents and Caregivers

Welcome to the new school year. Welcome to the 349 new Year 9 students, plus 16 new staff, 28 new International Students, and 19 other in zone students who are entering the school at Years 10-13. Altogether, including staff, we have 412 people new to our community in 2018. Welcome to you all.

Yesterday, the formal powhiri welcomed those who were manuhiri and celebrated their transition to tangata whenua. Thank you to the large number of parents and whanau who were present. Such a gathering highlights the inadequacy of the hall in terms of capacity and I'm grateful for people's good-humoured tolerance of the squeezed circumstances. I also want to thank Hutt Central, who loaned us their four large pedestal fans so we could ensure some decent air flow.

Recent days have been slightly challenging, and not just because of the series of warm days. In 2017/18 we have been experiencing very strong demand for places in the school and while this is a good problem to have at one level - as an indicator that families value the programme and style of the school - it also creates challenges. Two days ago we added a 13th Year 9 class, following 15 additional in-zone Year 9 enrolments in the last week. People will have read in the media of teacher shortages and that is absolutely the case, but we have been incredibly fortunate that among our teachers we have part time staff whose family arrangements mean they prefer not to teach a full load, yet who have been willing to take on the additional hours the new class has generated. At this moment we are fully staffed.

As we launch the year we are very keen to see our students take on responsibility and leadership. One project under way with Year 13 students is the Subject Ambassador role. This has appeared in a

lighter form in the last two years and we are looking to expand and formalise it. We are seeking Year 13 volunteers to link with a favourite subject area and offer support to students and staff in the events and processes of the subject. This can range from helping teachers decorate rooms, to assisting with lunchtime events, running clubs or activities, tutoring younger students who need help, supporting the subject's Open Evening presentations and offering "insider" advice to students contemplating taking a subject in the senior school. Interested students should contact the Year 13 deans.

Year 9 students have already seen the displays for some of the many clubs, societies, activities and sports in the school. While our focus in these early days is very much on getting new students connected with wider school life, it's also a point where I hope existing students reconsider their involvement in sports and other activities. Taking on a new interest, sport or activity is a great way to meet a different set of people and to expand the daily school experience. We'd love to see every student taking part in a sport or sports, as well as joining in the wider range of activities and clubs that are offered by our large number of volunteers. And to those volunteers - thank you so much for making these opportunities possible. We'd be a much poorer school without your help.

Return of external exam papers, reconsideration and review applications for 2017 NCEA and Scholarship external examination results

All NCEA material should be returned to candidates by mid February. DVC and Technology portfolios might be returned to schools (contact your Technology teacher for these)
Scholarship booklets will be returned after the release of results in February.

Review and Reconsideration applications for 2017 external examination results

Reviews and re considerations are done through learner logins. It is advisable for students to talk to their teachers prior to applying for a review or reconsideration. The original answer booklet must accompany any application for a review or reconsideration except for eMCAT and digitally submitted Technology standards (91371 and 91636).

Review application process:

In a review all sections of a booklet or portfolio are checked to make sure they have been marked and results correctly recorded and transferred. A review does not involve re-marking and there is no charge. Students should go on line and print off a copy of the personalised review form from their Learner Login.

Applications for reviews of NCEA externally assessed standards close on **Friday 16 February and for Scholarship on Friday 2 March.**

Reconsideration application process:

A reconsideration involves re-marking all answers in the answer booklet. It also involves checking mechanical processes, like transferring grades. NCEA reconsiderations cost \$20.40 for each standard. The fee for Design and Visual Communication (DVC) and Technology portfolios is \$20.40 for each external achievement standard, not each portfolio. The fee for Scholarship reconsiderations is \$30.70 per standard (subject).

Students must apply for reconsideration through their Learner Login. Payment may also be made online. **Where the reconsideration leads to a change of final grade the fee is refunded.**

Applications for reconsideration of Level 3 and Scholarship Visual Arts can also be made online. For Level 3, three high-quality A4 coloured photographs, one for each panel of the portfolio, are to be sent. Scholarship applications must include both photographs and workbook. In addition, an authenticity declaration must be completed by a candidate's school and sent with any application. No portfolios are to be sent to NZQA.

Applications for reconsiderations for NCEA externally assessed standards close on Friday 16 February and for Scholarship on Friday 2 March.
